Fr Bart Dudek

I am pleased to announce that Fr Bart Dudek, at present parish priest at St Simon Stock in Walderslade, Kent, has been appointed to be the new parish priest here at St Thomas More.

Fr Bart grew up in Domaradz in eastern Poland. At the age of 19 he went to seminary in Prezemysl and was ordained priest in 2009. He was an assistant priest in Poland for two years before coming to Maidstone parish in August 2011 where he worked as an assistant priest for five years. He moved to Walderslade in 2016 and in April 2019, was incardinated into the Archdiocese of Southwark.

Fr Bart is due to take up his new appointment at the beginning of September and I am sure you will make him welcome to his first London appointment and enable him to settle into his new role quickly. At this challenging time for the Church, Fr Bart brings youthful energy and vision to the work of the parish as it begins a new chapter in its history. Fr Gerry
